Q1 Class (450cc): Maximum capacity of 450cc quad may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday.

Q2 Class (OPEN): Any capacity quad larger than 450cc may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 18th birthday.

QMasters: Any capacity quad may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 38th birthday and older.

QLadies: Any capacity quad may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 d) for competitors up to and including the year of their 16th birthday.

REGIONAL SNR MOTORCYCLES (Minimum of a Regional Licence or One Event Regional Licence only)

Pro OR1 (OPEN): Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity in excess of 251cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity in excess of 401cc. Open to competitors from their 18th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e) and g).

Pro OR2 (250cc): Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity greater than 201cc but not exceeding 251cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity greater than 251cc but not exceeding 401cc. Open to competitors from their 18th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e) and g).

Pro OR3 (200cc): Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 201cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 251cc. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e), f) and g).

High School: Restricted to motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 125cc 2-stroke. Open to competitors from the year of their 15th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 18th birthday occurs.

Seniors: Any capacity motorcycle may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 36th birthday and older.

Masters: Any capacity motorcycle may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 46th birthday and older.

Ladies: Any capacity motorcycle may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e), f) and q).

REGIONAL JNR MOTORCYCLE AND QUADS (Minimum of a Regional Licence or One Event Regional Licence only)

Junior 50cc: Chassis, suspension and engine modifications unrestricted. The maximum permissible capacity is 50cc. Open to competitors from the year of their 5th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 9th birthday occurs. <u>Please note</u>: The age for female competitors will be from the year of their 5th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 10th birthday occurs.

Junior 65cc: Chassis, suspension and engine modifications unrestricted. The maximum permissible capacity is 66cc 2-stroke or 81cc 4-stroke. Minimum and maximum wheel size 12" rear and 14" front. Open to competitors from the year of their 7th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 12th birthday occurs. Please note: The age for female competitors will be from the year of their 7th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 13th birthday occurs.

Junior 85cc: Chassis, suspension and engine modifications unrestricted. The maximum permissible capacity is 86cc 2-stroke or 125cc 4-stroke air cooled. Minimum wheel size 14" rear and 17" front. Maximum wheel size 16" rear and 19" front. Open to competitors from the year of their 8th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 13th birthday occurs. Please note: The age for female competitors will be from the year of their 8th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 14th birthday occurs.

Senior 85cc: Chassis, suspension and engine modifications unrestricted. The maximum permissible capacity is 150cc 4-stroke. Minimum wheel size 14" rear and 17" front. Maximum wheel size 16" rear and 19" front. Open to competitors from the year of their 13th birthday to 31

December of the year in which their 15th birthday occurs. <u>Please note</u>: The age for female competitors will be from the year of their 13th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 16th birthday occurs.

QMasters: Any capacity quad may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 38th birthday and older.

QLadies: Any capacity quad may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 d) for competitors up to and including the year of their 16th birthday.

QWOW: Any capacity quad may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older.

<u>CLUB SNR MOTORCYCLES</u> (Minimum of a Club Licence or One Event Club Licence only)

Pro OR1 (OPEN): Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity in excess of 251cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity in excess of 401cc. Open to competitors from their 18th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e) and g).

Pro-Amateur OR1 (OPEN): Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity in excess of 251cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity in excess of 401cc. Open to competitors from their 18th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e) and g).

Pro OR2 (250cc): Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity greater than 201cc but not exceeding 251cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity greater than 251cc but not exceeding 401cc. Open to competitors from their 18th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e) and g).

Pro-Amateur OR2 (250cc): Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity greater than 201cc but not exceeding 251cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity greater than 251cc but not exceeding 401cc. Open to competitors from their 18th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e) and g).

Pro OR3 (200cc): Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 201cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 251cc. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e), f) and g).

Pro-Amateur OR3 (200cc): Two stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 201cc and four stroke motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 251cc. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e), f) and g).

High School: Restricted to motorcycles with an engine capacity not exceeding 125cc 2-stroke. Open to competitors from the year of their 15th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 18th birthday occurs.

Seniors: Any capacity motorcycle may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 36th birthday and older.

Masters: Any capacity motorcycle may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 46th birthday and older.

Ladies: Any capacity motorcycle may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e), f) and g).

Pro-Amateur Ladies: Any capacity motorcycle may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older. Refer SSR 325 e), f) and g).

Bikes WOW: Any capacity motorcycle may be used. Open to competitors from the year of their 16th birthday and older.

CLUB JNR MOTORCYCLE AND QUADS (Minimum of a Club Licence or One Event Club Licence only)

Junior 50cc: Chassis, suspension and engine modifications unrestricted. The maximum permissible capacity is 50cc. Open to competitors from the year of their 5th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 9th birthday occurs. <u>Please note</u>: The age for female competitors will be from the year of their 5th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 10th birthday occurs.

Junior 65cc: Chassis, suspension and engine modifications unrestricted. The maximum permissible capacity is 66cc 2-stroke or 81cc 4-stroke. Minimum and maximum wheel size 12" rear and 14" front. Open to competitors from the year of their 7th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 12th birthday occurs. Please note: The age for female competitors will be from the year of their 7th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 13th birthday occurs.

Junior 85cc: Chassis, suspension and engine modifications unrestricted. The maximum permissible capacity is 86cc 2-stroke or 125cc 4-stroke air cooled. Minimum wheel size 14" rear and 17" front. Maximum wheel size 16" rear and 19" front. Open to competitors from the year of their 8th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 13th birthday occurs. Please note: The age for female competitors will be from the year of their 8th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 14th birthday occurs.

Senior 85cc: Chassis, suspension and engine modifications unrestricted. The maximum permissible capacity is 150cc 4-stroke. Minimum wheel size 14" rear and 17" front. Maximum wheel size 16" rear and 19" front. Open to competitors from the year of their 13th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 15th birthday occurs. Please note: The age for female competitors will be from the year of their 13th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 16th birthday occurs.

Junior WOW: Age and motorcycle capacity specific as per the Junior classes mentioned above. Open to competitors from the year of their 5th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 15th birthday occurs. <u>Please note</u>: The age for female competitors will be from the year of their 5th birthday to 31 December of the year in which their 16th birthday occurs.

As the organizer we have fully acquainted ourselves with SSR 340 of the 2020 MSA SA National Cross Country Motorcycle and Quad Standing Supplementary Regulations.

We the organizers are also aware and have acquainted ourselves with the provisions of Section 317 of the Road Traffic Act and confirm that the event officials have been made aware of the above section. By allowing the event to proceed we accept that all requirements are complied with and where applicable all relevant permissions are in place.

20. GENERAL:

The Safety Plan will be available at Race Control and will be available from the race secretary, as per the requirements of THE SAFETY & RECREATION ACT 2 OF 2010.

Every Pit is required to have a Fire Extinguisher of at least a 2.5 kg capacity.

Every Rider is required to use an Environmental Mat when refueling

Failure to meet these requirements will result in a both a fine and/or a penalty being imposed.
