6. INJURY REGISTER

It is the responsibility of the competitor to check the Injury Register and ensure that MSA receives their letter timeously.

Please Note: Competing while appearing on the injury register will result in potential claims being repudiated by the MSA Group Accident Policy.

2000 spectators may be permitted to attend MSA-sanctioned motorsport events subject to masks being worn, appropriate physical distancing and hand cleanliness being maintained. The onus is on the owner or operator of a motorsport facility to ensure compliance with the limitations around spectator attendance. Offenders shall be guilty of an offence and liable to being fined and/or imprisoned upon conviction in a court of law.

All attendees are encouraged to be vaccinated.

No entry will be granted to the event premises without the suitable documentation being completed, and in order, in advance of the event.

Under no circumstances shall anyone with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 (such as fever, respiratory symptoms, shortness of breath, sore throat, cough, fatigue, loss of taste or lack of sense of smell) or who has tested positive for COVID-19, be admitted to a motorsport event.

Under no circumstances shall anyone attend a Motorsport event if they have been:

- Diagnosed with COVID-19 in the previous 14 days; or
- Have been in contact with a known COVID-19 positive case in the previous 14 days.
